New Local Bus Service introduced

New Services 51 and 51A have been introduced. These services operate between Doncaster, Woodlands, Carcroft, Skellow, Burghwallis and Askern.

Both the 51 and 51A operate hourly providing an approximately 30minute service between Doncaster and Askern. Both services operate from Carcroft via Skellow Road, Hampole Balk Lane, Crabgate Lane, Grange Lane to Burghwallis.

From Burghwallis, the 51 operates via **Sutton** to Askern, Instoneville Estate. The 51 operates via **Campsall**, Askern High Street to Askern, Instoneville Estate. The new 51 and 51A restores a bus services to Burghwallis and also provide local links between Skellow/Carcroft and Askern.

NORTON PARISH PEOPLE - IN THE PARK

Restoration of the stone bridge - making a major impact in Campsall Country Park



The centuries-old stone bridge in Campsall Country Park – once part of a stately home's grounds and no doubt a meeting place for both people 'upstairs' and 'downstairs' had not only fallen into disrepair, but had almost become invisible amongst overgrowth and trees.

Collaboration by Doncaster MBC, led by Pat Hagan, Head of Community
Services, Friends of Campsall Country
Park and Norton Parish Council has enabled the re-building of the bridge to take place.

A great deal of preparatory work has taken place to allow the building work to progress but now that there is once again a clearing and lost or damaged stone blocks have been recovered, the real restoration work has gathered pace.

Any recent visitor to the park will have been impressed by the elegance of the new stonework and the meticulous attention to detail given by the stonemasons.



Thank you to the unofficial 'guardians' of the work in the park - the walkers who are being the eyes and ears to deter a small minority of vandals who seek to impede progress through attempted vandalism.

The Stonemason Team

Led by **Peter Moore** (pictured above on the right) the stonemason team have dressed old stone and sourced new stone (magnesium limestone) from Hampole to re-create the bridge structure. Peter has 41 years of experience of stonemasonry and worked on many projects country-wide, as well as locally – the Hyde Park Cemetery in Doncaster being one example, plus at least seven bridges. His expertise is easy to see as the dressed stone interlocks to blend old and new. His knowledge and enthusiasm is shared by his colleagues, **Carl Wood** (left) and **Steve Dalton** (centre) who are enjoying the challenges presented to them to create what will be a striking structure. The stonework should be completed by the end of November and then subsequently metal handrails will be secured to the sides to reproduce the original look of the bridge. Plans are also in hand to dredge the stream beneath the bridge and seek to restore a steady flow of water beneath.

We are also indebted to Senior DMBC Engineer, Mark Watson and his understudy, Simon Davies for the superb project planning that has taken place and especially to our DMBC Councillor, **Austen White**, who has relentlessly helped to drive the project.

As part of the on-going work within the park, **Parish Councillor Colin Wilson** had the excellent idea of installing a **TIME CAPSULE** in the Park grounds. Quickly taken up by Friends of Campsall Country Park and funded by the Parish Council, Colin has masterminded the selection and collection of the contents which will be sealed in a container to be opened perhaps in 100 years time!

The numerous contents include lots of examples of contemporary life – written accounts, artefacts such as a mobile phone and a photographic record of what the park and village look like today.



Norton Women's Institute

Norton WI hosted the very first **Craft and Produce Show** at Campsall Village Hall on Saturday 24th September and it was a huge success!

So much so, that everyone wants it to be an annual event, rather than a one-off to celebrate three 90th birthdays – that of Norton WI itself, Campsall Village Hall and of course HRH the Queen. There were 50 classes to be entered, ranging from decorated cup cakes, scones and jars of chutney to cross-stitch and knitted items, to carrots, potatoes and gigantic onions. Anyone and everyone from surrounding villages was encouraged to enter.

The Victoria sandwich class (á la Mary Berry) was very competitive, with 11 entries. First place went to Cynthia Hunt from Bentley. There were 19 entries for jam, with first prize going to Annette Brydon from Campsall. The prize for a misshapen vegetable went to Paul Mawson from Moss with an extremely ugly beetroot over 12" long and Joe Hartich and his granddad from Edenthorpe won first for a huge marrow over 3' long! Lots of people came for tea and cakes in the afternoon and stayed for the highlight of the day – the Grand Auction of produce, expertly conducted by the vicar, the Revd Richard Walton. Over £500 was raised, to be shared between the WI and The Doncaster Cancer Detection appeal.

The Fashion Show organised with the Complete Clothing Company, held at the Norton Coronation WMC on the 24th October was so well attended that it was almost 'standing room only'! Over 150 ladies were eager to get a bargain and there were so many on offer. Members of the WI and staff from the WMC bravely acted as models, showing off clothes from most of the High Street brands. The evening raised £486, again shared equally between the WI and The Doncaster Cancer Detection appeal.

Now we've made a start, it's hoped lots more people will think "I could do better than that!" and enter – the more the merrier! Put the date in your diary for next year – Saturday 9th September 2017.

PROJECT FAIR PLAY 2

Parent and Toddler Groups in Campsall and Norton; First Aid classes; summer holiday multi-sports for children; opportunities for older people to create hanging baskets; parents learning how to help their little ones love books, and young teenagers learning how to make an animated film - all these activities have taken place free of charge in Norton parish over the past year, thanks to funding from Awards for All, the Small Grants fund from The Big Lottery.

The Campsall 4A Trust Fair Play 2 was the fourth project aimed at bringing physical, social and creative activities into the villages for local people to enjoy.

No takers for Number Sacks this year, so instead we engaged Breaking Beats to deliver two taster sessions in film animation for young teenagers at the end of the project. There's a possibility of developing this further if funding becomes available.

To the end of September, the number of times an individual engaged with the project was around 2,400. 72 children took part in the summer holiday multi-sports on at least one occasion, with many attending a large proportion of the 15 sessions available. The two Toddler groups continue to thrive, with average attendances of 25 people per session.

Campsall 4A Trust would like to thank all the sessional staff who have made these projects such a success: Play-leaders Cheryl Audsley, Caroline Savic (now enjoying life in North Yorkshire) and Sarah Winkley, who run the toddler groups; Sarah and Emma of Discovery Training for the First Aid; Brad Johnston and his team of coaches who lead the Multi-sports; Doncaster Council's Adult and Child Family Learning team for the Story Sacks; Adwick Community Enterprise for the hanging basket sessions. We're also grateful to Norton Parish Council for its support with the cost of pitch hire and, this summer, in funding an additional sports coach for 2 weeks when the number of children exceeded expectations.

Fair Play 2 came to an end on 31st October and, at the time of writing; no follow-on funding has yet been secured although there is a bid in the pipeline.

Thanks again to all who helped make Fair Play 2 a success, whether by leading an activity or by taking part.
