

## **PARK DEVELOPMENTS...**

You will have noticed that areas are being cleared where possible and in keeping with a country park to encourage more birds to breed and wild flowers to develop, bird boxes have also been installed, and information boards have been erected.

We are in discussions with DMBC about additional play equipment, a new fitness trail (fitness equipment was taken out a few years ago as no one used them) additional hard walkways, and cycle routes.

In the near future it is planned that Campsall Park and Warren Park Askern could be linked and have a park warden present.

## The Old Bells Inn Campsall

Statement from  
Norton Parish  
Council

As a response to our Parish Survey which was taken in 2018 we received comments asking if we would ask the question what was going to happen to The Old Bells Inn on High Street Campsall? As we know The Old Bells Inn has been empty for 4 years and is awaiting a tenant to lease the building. We are very aware that the Inn has become an eyesore for all who live around it, and the public who pass by which I am sure many of us do every day.

The Parish Council felt that it was important for us to make a statement on the current position regarding the inn.

Criterion Asset Management maintains and secures the building on behalf of the Wellington Pub Company who are the owners of The Old Bells Inn for a large property concern called Reuben Brothers, based in London.

A meeting has recently taken place inside The Old Bells with members of the Parish Council, the property manager from Criterion Asset Management, a DMBC Councillor and Doncaster Council's Principal Planner of Design and Conservation to express the concerns on behalf of the local community.

We stressed the neglected appearance of the Old Bells Inn, and went on to remind them that The Old Bells is a much-loved historic Grade 2 listed building within our conservation village and is reputed to be the oldest coaching Inn in Yorkshire. It commands a dominant position on the High Street alongside the ancient Norman Church in the village of Campsall and we need something done to improve the outside appearance of the inn which would also help towards securing a tenant for the building.

The response received from Criterion Asset Management was that The Wellington Pub Company are very reluctant to agree to any work on the building until a tenant is in place. If and when a lease is agreed they will offer a reduced rent for the building to be repaired/re-decorated. The amount they are prepared to grant will depend on the amount of years a tenant would commit to on a lease. However, the figures involved are considerable. To rent or lease the building would be £27,500 per annum. The company does not wish to put the building up for sale.

Doncaster MBC have informed us that they have a policy on neglected buildings. In the first instance they have a duty to ensure that buildings are wind and weather-proof and secure against vandalism. Unfortunately, the legislation does not give them the powers to enforce the owner of a building to use it or keep it open. At this present time, they are of the view that the building is not in a state of sufficient disrepair to merit taking formal action under the Planning (Listed Buildings and Conservation Areas) Act 1990.

We will update our progress in the next Parish Council magazine.

Once I have received a start date I shall endeavour to update the parish council further.

The Tour De Yorkshire Stage 1 Men's Race Doncaster to Selby a distance of 178.5 kms will take place on **Thursday 2<sup>nd</sup> May 2019** traveling through Campsall and Norton

The Tour De Yorkshire is scheduled to leave Doncaster Market Place at approx. 13.30 and arrive with us approx. 15 minutes later coming through Askern, then up Churchfield Road and around Campsall Corner, along Ryecroft Road, Kirk Smeaton, Womersley, and onto East Yorkshire (Start time is yet to be confirmed)

Before the race arrives, there will be events taking place - past riders will be around to talk with the crowds, there will be a caravan parade - all for everyone to enjoy before the race riders arrive.

We want to encourage everyone to decorate our area especially along the route with bicycles, bunting, banners, flags, land art in the theme colours of **blue and yellow**.

The sponsors will be traveling the route two weeks prior to the race to identify the best decorated homes, land art, businesses and villages for the TV crews and the helicopter pilot to identify for screening worldwide on the race day.

Several prizes - including travelling the route inside one of the teams sponsor cars on the race day, signed official prints of the main riders, tee shirts and many more items will be awarded as prizes.

## CARING FOR THE ENVIRONMENT

**Norton Parish Council's Litter Squad and NORTON JUNIOR SCHOOL make a difference!**



The Year 6 pupils at Norton Junior School have been studying the catastrophic effect of plastic on our world. As a result, they have designed a three-fold leaflet called "PLASTIC WORLD" that demonstrates their mature and compassionate attitude to this topic.

Extracts from the leaflet are shown below:

### What did Year 6 do to help?

On Monday 19<sup>th</sup> November, the Year 6 team went out into the Campsall woodlands and we all played our part by picking up all the litter in the top part of the woodlands. We still can't believe the shocking results and how much we collected! Not only is this demolishing the woodlands, it's killing off our precious animals!

During the litter pick we found a shocking result of 782 pieces of rubbish – which is a lot for that small area of woodland. There were 17 glass bottles, 121 plastic bottles, 328 pieces of other plastics, 171 pieces of textiles and 109 pieces of paper and cardboard!

As you can tell that's a lot of rubbish but we wouldn't have to tell you if people would find a bin to put the litter in.

### Plastic Problems

Plastic may be useful, but it is a killer. It is a really big problem in our world and it needs to stop. As we all know, plastic is NOT biodegradable – which is a big threat to our amazing world and the first bit of plastic ever made is still on the earth today! Shockingly, it is estimated that there are more micro plastic particles in the ocean than there are stars in the Milky Way (micro plastic is very small pieces of plastic that cause a HUGE environmental problem). The biggest problem is single-use plastic which is a type of plastic that you can only use once. For example a cotton bud is NOT reusable.

Unfortunately, animals from the deep depths of the ocean to ones that fly high above the clouds get affected by plastic. In other words, plastic reaches every nook and cranny

### What can YOU do to help?

As always, we would love your help and kindness! Please buy reusable water bottles because things like this can make a big difference to our planet!

At home, we all now have bins which we can use to re-cycle rubbish. Also when you're out and about make sure that you take any rubbish home with you and re-cycle what you can.
