### **TANGLES**

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




At 11 am on Boxing Day just gone, 65 people stood at the top of Park Drive Campsall, just as others have done all the way back to Boxing Day 1976. Some were there to maintain a tradition, some to burn off Christmas excess, others simply to test themselves physically. Whatever their reasons they were all there to move as quickly as they could over a 3-mile (5 km) course, taking in tarmac roads and muddy, rutted lanes around our parish.

The idea for a run came from my Dad, Pat O'Grady, sometime in the mid 70's. He and a group of other individuals had formed an informal running group which was christened the Campsall Cardiacs. This was the era of the great running boom and they would regularly meet at our house (55 Park Drive) to enjoy running, keeping fit and also to improve their times in established races.

Pat being a big advocate of maintaining footpaths decided to arrange a race over local paths to encourage others to value their use too and so, on Boxing Day 1976 - which paradoxically was the  $27^{\text{th}}$  due to Christmas Day being a Saturday - 8 people completed the 3-mile course and started what has been a tradition maintained by him and my Mum, Ann O'Grady.

As a member of the Parish Council at the time, Pat managed to persuade them to donate a perpetual shield to record the 1st finisher which it has done every year since.

There are many local names which grace this shield and the other shields which have joined it so that we could celebrate the 1<sup>st</sup> woman, as well as 1<sup>st</sup> Under 16.

In 2022 we were kindly donated 3 new shields by the family of the late Eileen Shaw who worked for so many years at Norton Infant School.



Eileen had been a keen runner and from the money raised in memorial, it seemed fitting to remember her and encourage others to do what she had loved doing. The three new shields will now collect the names of 1st Lady, 1st U16 girl and 1st U 16 boy.

Another tradition is a collection of donations from those who run and this year we raised £300 which was sent to the Red Cross.

- Norton Coronation Club,
- Campsall Village Hall
- Anne Arms.

Your Parish Council funds the replacement of Pads and batteries for the defibrillators and volunteers manage with 'The Circuit' regular checks and replacement of the consumable equipment.

## Speed Reduction Signs For Sutton

Following the installation of Electronic Speed Reduction Signs at various places in the parish and their success in reminding motorists to observe the speed limit, the Parish Council is providing funding for two more signs.

These next signs like these shown below, will be installed on High Street, one facing traffic from Askern and one close by, facing traffic from Sutton Road.

Presently, some traffic from both directions travels much too fast and is clearly hazardous, in particular, to people on foot where the road narrows.

### Children at both Norton Infant and Junior school returned to school after the Christmas break eager to find out what their new expeditions and learning would be about.....


In the Early Years Foundation Stage, the children were delighted to learn of their expedition title and guiding question: Once Upon a Time -Who is hiding in the pages of this book? Here, they will use the popular traditional tales to learn about morality, problem solving and conflict resolution.... How can the goats and the troll be friends? How can Goldilocks show that she's sorry? How can we help the gingerbread man to cross the river?

Answers on a postcard please!

**In Key Stage 1** the expedition title *is The Blue Planet* and the guiding question *How will what I do today impact the world tomorrow?* During this expedition, children will use the story of The Blue Giant to explore the oceans and the impact of pollution. From this,they will create a bespoke information booklet about the river bank in our local area that will contain examples of beautiful artwork, activities for children to complete and a map of our local area.

Finally, in Years 5/6, the children are learning about local British history guided by the question: How has the Industrial Revolution influenced lives today? Here, our pupils will make connections to characters who worked in the workhouses to gain understanding and empathy for those who lived through the Industrial Revolution and also look at the development of railways linked to Doncaster.

We also have a regular coffee and cake club, a lunch club, as well as organising day trips and theatre outings.




